### WHAT WE LEARNED THIS WEEK

PONDER POINT: GOD IS FAITHFUL The Walls of Jerusalem Rebuilt

Nehemiah 1—4; 6—9

Following the Israelites' captivity, the walls of Jerusalem are still in ruins years after the Israelites are allowed to return to their homeland. God leads Nehemiah to return to Jerusalem and rally the people to rebuild the city walls.

# WHERE WE'RE HEADED NEXT TIME

PONDER POINT: JESUS IS KING The Triumphal Entry

Matthew 21:1-11

The people greet Jesus with praise as He rides into Jerusalem on a donkey.

#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

Share these facts to get the conversation started.

- The triumphal entry of King Jesus took place the Sunday before the crucifixion, shortly after He raised Lazarus from the dead.
- Even though Jesus' entry into Jerusalem was foretold by the prophets and pointed to the coming of the Messiah King, the manner in which He came was unexpected by the Jewish people of His day. They were expecting a mighty warrior, but instead Jesus came as a humble servant.
- There will come a day when Jesus will again ride into Jerusalem, clothed in regal splendor, riding on a white horse, and will enter victoriously into the city as the King of kings and Lord of lords (Revelation 19:11–16).

## **CONNECT AS A FAMILY**

One night this week, have each family member sit on a coat as you read **Matthew 21:1–11**. Then discuss with your children some things associated with being a king—for instance, crowns, jewels, and thrones. Ask how that's different from what you just read about Jesus. Share with your children how Zechariah foretold that the Messiah King would enter the city exactly the way Jesus did that day. Discuss how Jesus will return one day as the King of all kings.

After reading the Scripture passage, discuss these questions together:

- What does it mean that Jesus is King?
- What makes Jesus different from other kings?
- What can we learn from Jesus' example that day?
- How can we show that Jesus is our King?

These questions can easily extend into the rest of the week. Look for opportunities to bring conversations about how Jesus Is King into your everyday life as a family.

#### REMEMBER VERSE

The Remember Verse focuses on a character trait of God that's highlighted in next week's portion of The Big God Story.
